Mitansh, Shreyash, Anagh, Adhira, Piyush, Hansika, Radha, Darsh, Samruddhi and Viaan all from 1A.

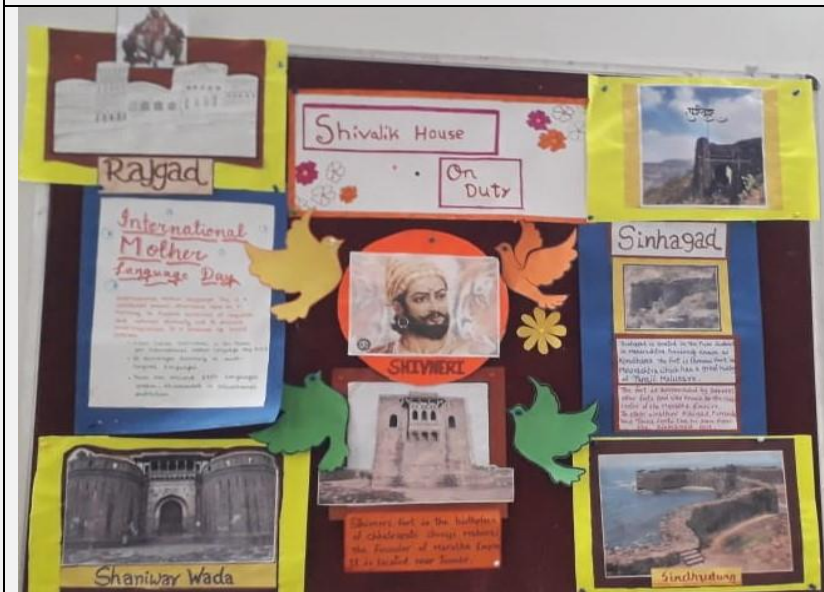
